

SENATE DEMOCRATIC CAUCUS PACKAGE COVERING:

HEALTH CARE

Healthy Wisconsin Plan.

- Incorporates Healthy Wisconsin Plan and creates Healthy Wisconsin Authority.

Dept of Health and Family Services – Medical Assistance – Long-Term Care

- Increases nursing home rates; bed assessment increase. Reflects a re-estimate of the Governor's proposal to fund nursing home rate increases by increasing the nursing home bed assessment and delays effective date of the increase to January 1, 2008. Increases funding for Wisconsin Veterans Home at King and the Veterans Home at Union Grove.
- Require DHFS to include Rock County in a labor union region that currently includes Dane, Iowa, Columbia and Sauk counties.
- ICF-MR Bed Assessment. Provide additional funds to enable the three state centers for the developmentally disabled to fully fund the cost of the bed assessment increase that would take effect on July 1, 2007.
- Provide additional positions for the state centers for the developmentally disabled so that 17.56 positions, rather than 24.20 positions, would be deleted due to placements from the centers under the CIP-IA program.
- Specify provisions in the bill that would replace the current titles of definitions of functional eligibility for the Family Care benefit with "nursing home level of care" rather than "comprehensive" and "non-nursing home level of care" rather than "intermediate."
- Direct DHFS to provide annual funding, from funds budgeted for Family Care aging and disability resource centers, to Grant County to provide, with respect to those issues concerning Family Care benefits, liaison services between the county and a managed care organization and advocacy services on behalf of the county.
- Delete current law provisions requiring DHFS to submit a request to JFC to provide services to more than 150 individuals under the nursing home diversion initiative. (Provision was deleted from bill as policy)
- Modify the provision in the bill directing the Office of the Commissioner of Insurance to develop training requirements for individuals who sell long-term care insurance policies to instead require OCI to approve training requirements.

Dept of Health and Family Services – Medical Assistance – Other

- Provide funding from the health care quality fund and reduce Fed funding to reflect the administration's revised estimates of the cost of the governor's proposal to expand primary and preventive health care services to adults under age 65 who have family incomes up to 200% of the federal poverty level and who are not otherwise eligible for MA, BadgerCare or Medicare and who did not have coverage under the health insurance risk sharing plan within six months of applying to participate in the project.

Dept of Health and Family Services – Health

- Health Care Quality Fund. Increase funding by \$20,000,000 for tobacco use control grants. Increase amount of cigarette tax to be deposited in the fund.
- Modify JFC provision that would provide additional SEG from the HCQF for DHFS to distribute to a health center to establish a dedicated colposcopy program and fund on-going operations services for services provided to individuals enrolled in or eligible for medical assistance to fund the item from GPR rather than SEG revenues.
- Modify the JFC provision that would provide \$62,500 SEG annually from the HCQF to provide additional breast cancer and cervical cancer screenings under the Wisconsin well-woman program so the item would be funded by GPR.
- Provide \$25,000 GPR annually to HealthNet of Janesville, Inc. to provide health care services to uninsured and low-income residents of rock County.
- Provide \$35,000 in one-time funding to the Community Connections Free Clinic in Dodgeville to expand the clinic's capacity to provide dental services to low-income residents of Iowa County and surrounding areas.

Dept of Health and Family Services – Family and Human Services

- Provide one-time funding of \$500,000 to fund the comprehensive early childhood initiative that provides home visiting and employment preparation and support for low-income families in Dane County in order to expand the initiative to one new neighborhood and provide on-going support for the current Allied Drive early childhood initiative.
- Increase estimates of supplemental security benefits payments to reflect a re-estimate of the funding needed to fully fund state SSI supplemental benefits.
- Provide \$100,000 annually from the lottery fund to the Wisconsin Council on Problem Gambling to provide funding for staff to a 24-hour hotline providing assistance to compulsive gamblers and their families.
- Delete the JFC provision that would transfer the Wisconsin Council on Developmental Disabilities from DHFS to the Dept of Children and Families. Instead, create a new agency, the Board for People with Developmental Disabilities, and assign the agency statutory responsibilities currently assigned to the Council.

ADMINISTRATION AND JUSTICE

Dept of Administration – General Agency Provisions

- Increase amounts provided for county management assistance grants to Menominee County by \$50,000 PR annually from tribal gaming revenue.
- Provide one-time funding of \$50,000 in 07-08 to fund parking lot and road improvements at the Cleghorn Community Center in the Town of Pleasant Prairie, Eau Claire County.

Dept of Administration – Transfers to the Department

- With exceptions, restore Governor's recommendation deleted by JFC to consolidate certain attorneys and legal staff under DOA.

Dept of Administration – Information Technology

- Require DOA to implement, operate, maintain and upgrade an integrated business information system capable of providing information technology services to all executive branch agencies for all financial services, procurement, human resources and other administrative duties.
- Provide funding for space rental costs, maintenance, fuel and utilities, taxes and fiber optics for the new data center in Madison; require DOA to publish on its website information for all technology projects.

Dept of Administration --- Office of Justice Assistance

- Provide funding for annual grants of \$20,000 to each of 12 child advocacy centers for education, training, medical advice and quality assurance activities. The centers are: Care House in Rock County; Child Protection Center in Milwaukee County; Safe Harbor in Dane County; Kenosha Child Advocacy Center in Kenosha County; Fox Valley Child Advocacy Center in Winnebago County; Stepping Stones in La Crosse County; CARE Center in Waukesha County; Child Advocacy Center of Northeastern Wisconsin in Marathon County; Chippewa County Child Advocacy Center; a center in Brown County, Racine County and Walworth County.
- Direct a grant of \$150,000 FED annually to the Wisconsin CASA (Court-appointed special advocates) Association for support, assistance and development of court-appointed special advocate programs.
- Provide a three-year grant totaling \$112,500 FED to the Cops-n-Kids Reading program in the City of Racine.
- Provide a grant of \$61,400 FED, funded with federal criminal-justice related grant funds, to purchase mobile data computers for law enforcement vehicles in the City of Fort Atkinson.
- Provide a grant of \$10,000 FED, funded with federal homeland security grant dollars, to purchase an emergency generator for the Town of Sumner in Jefferson County.

Circuit Courts

- Create a new circuit court branch for Kenosha County.

Corrections

- Rename the Parole Commission the Earned Release Review Commission and expand the authority of the commission to modify bifurcated sentences.
- Modify current law to provide for the following locations for confinement as a sanction if a person released to extended supervision signs a statement admitting a violation of a condition of extended supervision: a facility owned by the Dept of Corrections, a Huber facility, or a work camp.
- Technical modifications to GPS tracking of certain child sex offenders.

District Attorneys

- Convert the elected district attorney position in Trempealeau County to full-time status.
- Provide additional ADA positions to: Polk County; Rock County; and St. Croix County.

Legislature

- Create a continuing program revenue appropriation under the Legislature for the receipt and expenditures for gifts and grants by either the Senate or Assembly. Intent of the provision is to allow support of the Senate Scholars Program.

ENVIRONMENT AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Dept of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection

- Create a Buy Local, Buy Wisconsin Program with DATCP awarding grants to individuals and organizations to fund projects designed to increase the local sales of agricultural products grown in Wisconsin. Deleted \$225,000 GPR from the Dept of Commerce's Wisconsin development fund appropriation.
- Provide additional \$50,000 GPR annual (for a total of \$400,000 GPR annually) for aids to county and district fairs.

Dept of Commerce

- Transfer \$14,576,500 in 08-09 from the petroleum inspection fund to the general fund.
- Increase the transfer from WHEDA to Commerce for housing grants and loans by \$25,000 in 07-08; provide expenditure authority and specify Commerce make a grant of \$25,000 to the City of Oshkosh for neighborhood improvement and stabilization.
- Require grants of \$125,000 from the Wisconsin Development Fund in 07-08 and 08-08 to the Painters and Allied Trades District Council 7 of the AFL-CIO for training.
- Require a grant of \$160,00 from the Wisconsin Development Fund to the NanoRite Facility at Chippewa Valley Technical College.
- Require a grant of \$50,000 from the Wisconsin Development Fund to the City of Green Bay for maintenance and construction of the Cornerstone Ice Arena.
- Require a grant of \$50,000 from the Wisconsin Development Fund to the City of Eau Claire for renovation of the Hobbs Ice Arena.

Dept of Natural Resources

- Provide \$3 million recycling fund SEG annually and create a program to reimburse certain responsible parties for the difference between the cost of transporting PCB contaminated sediment to an out-of-state hazardous waste disposal facility and the cost of disposing the PCB contaminated sediment in Wisconsin.
- Authorize a restaurant or temporary restaurant to prepare and serve fish that are taken from the wild to the person who caught the fish, and to his or her guests, without obtaining a permit from the DNR if certain conditions are met. (Fish brought in by charter boats)
- Provide an additional \$29,000 to the Florence Wild Rivers Interpretive Center for forestry education, tourism and operational costs.
- Provide \$25,000 from existing aquatic invasive species grants program to the City of Oshkosh for invasive species education, prevention and control activities in Miller's Bay and adjacent water area in Lake Winnebago.
- Direct \$100,00 from the existing recreational boating grants appropriation to the City of Superior to complete a study of the corrosion of the dockwall in the Duluth/Superior Harbor.
- Shift up to \$100,000 SEG from ATV local trail aids for a landowner incentive program.

- Provide \$10,000 SEG from the ATV account of the conservation fund for the DNR to provide grants up to \$2000 per county to Florence, Forest, Sawyer, Marinette and Washburn counties and municipalities within those counties for a pilot program to investigate the effects of using lightweight utility vehicles on trails and roadways currently authorized to be used by ATVs. Define a “lightweight utility vehicle.”
- Provide \$400,000 SEG from the ATV account of the conservation fund for development of ATV trails in the Northern Highland-American Legion State Forest.
- Provide \$15,000 annually for estimated venison processing donations. Provide additional funds to reflect anticipated agricultural wildlife damage claims and abatement costs.
- Direct a grant up to \$200,000 from the municipal flood control grant program, but not to exceed 70% of the cost of the purchase of land along Highway 29, in the city of Chippewa Falls.

PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

- Delete the provision recommended by the governor and approved by JFC that would prohibit the PSC from encumbering or expending money for grants or supplemental grants to wireless providers and local governments or for the Commission’s administrative costs related to those grants after April 1, 2009. Delay the current law provisions for two years that establish sunset dates for wireless providers to impose monthly surcharges. (Delay sunset of the surcharge and extend the grant program for two years.)

GENERAL FUND TAXES AND SHARED REVENUE

General Fund Taxes

- Delete provisions in the bill that would increase the maximum annual and total amount of angel investment and early stage seed investment tax credits.
- Beginning with tax year 2008, require corporations that are subject to the state corporate income and franchise tax, and that are engaged in a unitary business, to file a combined report for state income and franchise taxes. (Combined Reporting) (DOR estimates this would increase corporate tax revenues by \$40.5 million in 07-08 and \$90 million in 08-09 and thereafter)
- Modify the method of calculating net income for regulated investment companies and real estate investment trusts to specify the divided paid deduction otherwise allowed by federal law in computing the net income of an RIC or REIT that is subject to federal income tax would be required to be added back to income in computing the state income and franchise tax unless the RIC or REIT was a qualified RIC or qualified REIT. Defines qualified RIC and REIT.
- Modify the sales and use tax to provide that certain inter-company transfers of assets between subsidiaries of the same parent company in which no money exchanged hands to qualify as retail sales. (Reponse to the March, 2007 State Supreme Court decision in *Wisconsin Department of Revenue v. River City Refuse Removal*.)
- Require the DOR to promulgate administrative rules for administering the sales and use tax paper return fee and that such rules limit the fee to \$5 per return.
- Authorize a caterer with a license to sell beer and/or intoxicating liquor (including wine) at retail for on- and off-premises consumption to sell beer and/or intoxicating liquor at the National Railroad Museum in Green Bay for special events at the Museum. (Defines caterer for this provision).

Shared Revenue and Tax Relief

- Exclude county special charges from the limitation on 2006 municipal property tax levies if the special charge is identified as being for the recovery of unlawful real estate taxes on a municipality’s statement of taxes for 2006 that was filed with the DOR and the special charge resulted from a 2005 tax amount that was rescinded due to an error, as defined under current law provisions. This provision would change the levy limit law for 2006-07) to cause the property tax levies for 12 municipalities to comply with the limitation. (Town of Middleton in Dane County; Town of Eaton, Brown County; Village of Shorewood Hills in Dane County; Town of Solon Springs in Douglas County; Town of Georgetown in Polk County; Town of Mount Ida in Grant County; Town of Hazelhurst in Oneida County; Village of Eleva in Trempealeau County; Town of Farmington in La Crosse County; Town of Laketown in Polk County; Town of Stanton in St. Croix County; and, Town of Parkland in Douglas County.

- Modify the property tax exemption for treatment plan and pollution abatement equipment (*Newark Decision*).
- Modify the property tax exemption for computers to exclude automatic teller machines, effective with property assessed as of January 1, 2008.
- Modify the current law definition of agricultural land to exclude any land that is platted and zoned for residential, commercial or industrial use, effective with property assessed as of January 1, 2008.

TRANSPORTATION

Dept of Transportation

- Modify the oil company assessment to create a graduated scale of rates at which gross receipts would be assessed based on each supplier's annual amount of gross receipts, rather than assessing all gross receipts at 2.5%. Also revise estimated revenues associated with other modifications to the proposed assessment. (The two modifications reflect the Governor's revised recommendations for the proposed assessment.)
- Reduce salary, fringe benefit and overtime funding for three auditor positions in the Dept of Revenue to reflect the positions would only be for nine months in 2007-08.
- Adopt various modifications to the oil company assessment.
- Specify the person responsible for taking any action to increase or influence the selling motor vehicle fuel to recover the amount of the assessment would be subject to possible penalty or up to six-month prison term. Define those persons.
- Increase the amounts in the vehicle registration fee schedule for heavy trucks (over 8000 pounds) by 10%, rounded to the nearest whole dollar.
- Delete \$33,913,500 SEG and 0.75 SEG position in 08-09 and provide the same in GPR to reflect the elimination, for the second year of the biennium, of provisions in the JFC sub that would convert 16 GPR appropriations in non-DOT agencies from GPR to SEG.
- Delete \$13,623,000 SEG in 08-09 and provide the same GPR to reflect elimination, for the second year of the biennium, of a provision in the JFC sub that would make the annual transfer to the Nonpoint pollution account of the environmental fund from the transportation fund instead of the General Fund. (Supplemental Title Transfer Fee).
- Delete \$43,300,000 SEG in 08-09 and provide the same GPR to reflect elimination, in the second year, of a provision in the JFC sub creating a transportation fund appropriation to supplement an existing GPR appropriation for debt service on bonds issued in the 03-05 and 05-07 biennia to replace transportation funds revenues used for general fund programs or purposes.
- Require DOT to submit to DOA and LFB, with each biennial budget request, a plan for the following ten-year period including certain information. (Transportation Bonding Policy Plan).
- Provide increased for general transportation aids to provide 3.0% annual calendar year increases for county aid and municipal aid. Establish mileage aid rate.
- Provide additional mass transit operating assistance.
- Provide additional lift bridge aids.
- Provide \$202,500 SEG for county assistance in the provision of elderly and disable specialized transportation services.
- Reduce funding for the state's share of the Amtrak Hiawatha route to reflect new estimates of the cost to maintain the service.
- Modify existing general obligation bonding authority for passenger rail service improvements to specify the bonds may be used for improvements to establish rail service between Madison and Eau Claire.
- Provide funding for the entitlement component of the local roads improvement program to provide total increases of 2.5% annually for the program.
- Provide additional funding for the discretionary component of the local roads improvement program to provide total increases of 2.5% annually.
- Provide increased funding for the aeronautics assistance program to provide total increases of 2.5% annually.
- Provide the Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Transit Authority with the responsibility to sponsor, develop, construct and operate a commuter rail transit system connecting the cities of Kenosha, Racine and Milwaukee (KRM) and grant authority to levy a vehicle rental fee up to \$15 per transaction in the three-county area; expend funds to develop and construct the KRM

commuter rail link; and to issue up to \$50 million in bonds for anticipated local funding share required for initiating the KRM service.

- Require the Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Transit Authority to conduct various studies on commuter rail services including feasibility of extending the project through the 30th Street Corridor in Milwaukee to the northern Milwaukee County line; adding stops at National Avenue and/or Greenfield Avenue.
- Require a grant of \$500,000 to the Town of Pound in Marinette County in TEA funds for the extension of North 19th Road to West 16th Road.
- Require a grant of \$2.1 million to Ashland County from the FED appropriation for local transportation facility improvement assistance for the improvement of CTH H on Madeline Island, if the DOT determines the project is eligible for federal aid during the biennium.
- Require a grant of \$800,000 to the City of Kenosha for extension of 39th Avenue from 18th street to 26th Street, if the DOT determines the project is eligible for federal aid.
- Require a grant to the City of Whitewater for extension of the Whitewater multi-use trail to Willis Ray Road, if the department determines the project is eligible for federal aid.
- Require a grant of \$400,000 to the City of Racine for a streetscaping project on 6th Street between Main Street and Grand Avenue, if the department determines the project is eligible for federal aid.
- Require a grant to the Town of Armstrong Creek in Forest County for the historical restoration of the red Bridge over the Armstrong Creek if the department determines the project is eligible for federal aid.
- Require a grant to the Village of Footville in Rock County for the paving of a walking trail, if the department determines the project is eligible for federal transportation enhancements funds.
- Require a grant of \$235,000 to the City of Janesville from the safe routes to school program for construction of a pedestrian tunnel for the Spring Brook Trail under East Milwaukee Street, if the department determines the project is eligible for federal aid.
- Provide additional SEG and FED funds in both years for the state highway rehabilitation program to provide total increases of 9.6% in 07-08 and 7.0% in 08-09.
- Provide additional funding in both years for the major highway development program to provide total increases of 5.2% in 07-08 and 6.1% in 08-09.
- Provide additional funds in both years of the biennium and reduce revenue bonding by corresponding amounts to maintain the use of revenue bonds at the base level.
- Provide \$23,300,000 SEG in 0-09 for the I-94 north-south freeway project and reduce the bonding authorization for the project by a same amount.
- Delete the provision in the JFC sub that would enumerate the Zoo Interchange project in the statutes to allow the construction of additional lanes on that project.
- Require DOT to complete a pavement resurfacing project on USH 14 between CTH O and STH 89 in Rock and Walworth counties during the biennium.
- Require DOT to complete a pavement rehabilitation project on I-43 between I-39/I-90 and STH 140 in Rock County during the biennium.
- Require DOT to conduct a study examining the potential transportation improvements that could improve access to businesses and promote economic development along CTH T north of STH 312 in the City of Eau Claire.
- Require DOT to study whether Tolles Road in Rock County should be added to the state trunk highway system as an extension of STH 138L.
- Require DOT to pay 75% of the cost of relocation of water and sewer utilities lying under STH 78 in the Village of Merrimac if the Department reconstructs the segment of the highway within the Village and requires the utilities to be relocated to a lower depth.
- Require DOT, during the biennium, to reimburse the City of Crandon for a portion of the costs of installing water and sewer utilities across USH 8 associated with the development of a Best Western hotel in the city.
- Require Dot to install traffic signals during the biennium at the intersection of USH 51 and Albion Road/Haugen road in the Town of Albion, Dane County.
- Delete the provision in the JFC sub providing for a single license plate; restore funding.

EDUCATION

Dept of Public Instruction

- Provide additional money for high poverty districts (Language in the document distributed will be revised.)
- Delete provision modifying funding split for the Milwaukee parental choice program. Deletion increases MPS aid reduction and MPS choice levy by \$21,012,300. Net state general fund expenditures related to choice would also decrease.
- Provide \$7.2 million to create a new categorical aid program for school districts meeting certain criteria (Aid to small rural districts).
- Provide \$6 million to fully fund a re-estimate of the amount needed for the \$2,250 per payment under the SAGE program.
- Provide \$250,000 annually and create a new annual appropriation for grants to school districts for nursing services.
- Specify that in addition to the 100% declining enrollment adjustment in the substitute, a district would receive additional adjustments.
- Delete provisions in the substitute relating to the school safety adjustment to revenue limits and provide a revenue limit increase in 07-08 equal to \$100 per pupil or \$40,000, whichever is greater to purchase school safety equipment or fund compensation costs for security officers.
- Provide a revenue limit increase for the salary and fringe benefit costs of school nurses employed by a school district, beginning in 07-08 school year.
- Restore governor's recommendations to repeal the QEO.
- Provide \$1,750,000 annually to create a new special education appropriation for supplemental education aid to school districts meeting certain criteria.
- Require that, if school library aid is used to purchase computers and software, they must be housed in the school library. Delete proposed requirement such purchases be approved by the school district's person who supervises the school district's libraries.
- Provide \$18,000 to the Belmont Community School District for its school library.
- Restore the governor's provision that would specify that a school board could construct or acquire, borrow funds to construct or acquire, operate and maintain a wind electricity generation facility.

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS

Dept of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection

- Provide \$800,000 from the agrichemical management fund for a grant to the Wisconsin Grazing Lands Conservation Initiative for technical education and research.

Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission

- Makes changes in disciplinary procedures for law enforcement officers and fire fighters.

General Fund Taxes

- Modify the current law with respect to the three-tier intoxicating liquor distribution system (which includes wine and distilled spirits)

General Provisions

- Provide for June 19 to be designated as Juneteenth Day and appropriation celebrations may be held. It would not be a paid holiday for state employees.

Dept of Natural Resources

- Allow aquatic invasive species donations.

Dept of Public Instruction

- Provide \$250,000 for the La Causa charter school in Milwaukee for library, science and technology improvements.

Dept of Regulation and Licensing

- Allow the department to set initial and renewal credential fees administratively rather than by statute.
- Require a specified lapse from its general program operations.

- Delete the JFC recommendation for regulation of wholesale drug distributors. Maintain current law fees for the regulation of drug distributors.

Shared Revenue and Tax Relief

- Modify current law provisions related to state aid payments to municipalities and counties containing production plants.
- Create a one-time payment for municipalities with manufacturing tax base reductions. Establish conditions.
- Delete provisions adopted by JFC regarding the exemption of low-income residential housing from the property tax.

UW System

- Reduce PR funding for the UW-La Crosse and provide some GPR to support its growth and access initiative.
- Provide \$5 million in one-time funding for the comprehensive cancer center, located at the UW School of Medicine for lung cancer research.
- Authorize the use of money from the universal service fund to pay for any telecommunications services across the UW System, rather than only for telecommunications services provided by DOA to the campuses at River Falls, Stout, Superior and Whitewater as under current law.

Dept of Veterans Affairs

- Provide funding for a matching grant for the refurbishment of the Korean War Memorial in Plover.

Dept of Workforce Development

- Increase funding to extend W-2 grants beginning in January, 2008, in the amount of \$673 per month to women who do not have children and are in their third trimester of an at-risk pregnancy. Sets eligibility.
- Require the department to regulate traveling sales crews.

Building Program

- Provide \$1 million in general fund supported bonding to make a grant in aid to the expansion of the Bond Health Center in the City of Oconto from four to 14 beds.

Dept of Health and Family Services – Family and Human Services

- Provide \$168,000 to community organizations in southcentral and southeastern Wisconsin to provide outreach services relating to health, mental health, housing, assisted living, domestic violence and other services.

Dept of Health and Family Services – Health

- Provide \$50,000 annually to the statewide poison control program to provide public and professional education services.
- Require DHFS to provide \$100,000 FED as a one-time grant to the Black Health Coalition of Wisconsin to provide HIV infection outreach, education referral and other services.

Dept of Natural Resources

- Direct DNR to submit a report by June 30, 2009 describing alternative ways of funding Milwaukee County parks.

Dept of Public Instruction

- Allocate \$35,000 annually from the current law pupil transportation aid appropriation to reimburse school districts for 75% of the cost of transporting pupils to and from an island over ice.

Public Service Commission

- Delete the provision in the JFC sub that would repeal the current law provision that extends universal service fund provisions to commercial mobile radio service providers under certain conditions.

Dept of Transportation

- Require DOT to make a grant of \$100,000 to Milwaukee County from the transportation enhancements grant program for construction of a pedestrian bridge and path at the Milwaukee Urban Ecology Center, if the department determines the project is eligible for federal aid.
- Require DOT to make a grant of \$800,000 to the City of West Allis from the congestion mitigation and air quality improvement program for the construction of the West Allis Cross-Town Bike Trail, if the department determines the project is eligible for federal aid.
- Specify that no southeast Wisconsin freeway rehabilitation project may include the addition of any lane for vehicular traffic on I-94 adjacent to Wood National Cemetery between Hawley Road and the Stadium Interchange in Milwaukee County.
